Proposed use of Funding (Supporting KS2 Sport opportunities)

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is continuing to provide funding to enable schools to develop the quality of sport and PE for all their children. This is a great opportunity for Littlegreen to raise the profile of PE and ensure that we are supporting our pupils to keep healthy, develop a love of sport and promote teamwork.

What is the money for?

The funding is to be used on improving the provision of PE and sport. Schools have freedom in how this money can be spent.

How can the money be spent?

The money can be spent in a number of ways including:

- Employing specialist PE teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE
- Providing cover staff to release teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- Running competitions and encouraging pupils to participate in school games
- Buying materials to develop PE within the school
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE

Nature of support proposed 2017/18

- Facilitate archery lessons as an extra-curricular activity – provided by Peter Ashley Activity Centre
- Albion in the Community to provide additional football coaching on a weekly basis
- Investment in play time equipment, including play leader equipment
- Purchase of safe and appropriate football goals for use during break times, PE lessons and inter-school competitions
- Additional Bikeability sessions aimed at young/beginner riders
- Investment in all-weather pitch facility on existing site
- Investment in a 'Daily Mile' outdoor track
- Transport to and from events
- Membership to Staunton Country Park
- Staff CPD provided by School Sports Partnership

Proposed Outcomes for PE and Sports Funding spending 2017/18

- Pupils have access to a wider range of new sporting activities aimed at increasing participation
- Additional coaching aimed at increasing participation, enjoyment and developing leadership and sportsmanship qualities
- Play leaders developing a leadership/coaching role at break times; wider choice of break time activities
- High staff:pupil ratio, ensuring high quality teaching and increased participation
- Football goals available all year round for PE lessons, break times and inter-school competitions – leading to greater participation
- Investment in equipment/resources means that a greater range of sporting opportunities are available to children
- More children able to ride a bike through additional Bikeability sessions
- All-weather pitch will mean that PE lessons will still go ahead regardless of weather conditions. This also will enable higher quality lessons to take place e.g. hockey
- All children to have the opportunity to take part in the Daily Mile – leading to high levels of participation as well as improvements in physical fitness and well-being
- Transport to and from events will enable children to participate in a greater range of inter-school events
- Membership to Staunton Country Park will provide further outdoor and adventurous (OAA) opportunities e.g. orienteering, team building etc
- Staff CPD will increase the quality of lessons taught, evidenced through observation. This leads to better outcomes for pupils.
